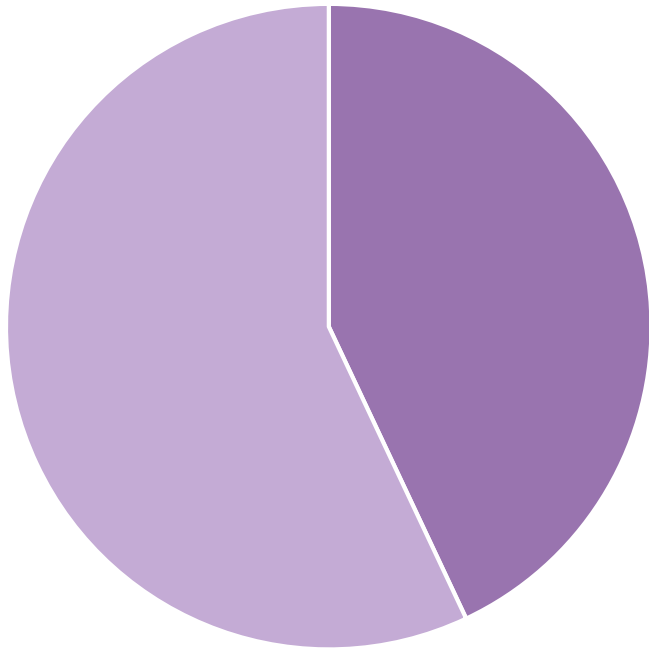
**1 IN 2 TRANS PEOPLE**

# Prevalence on Campus

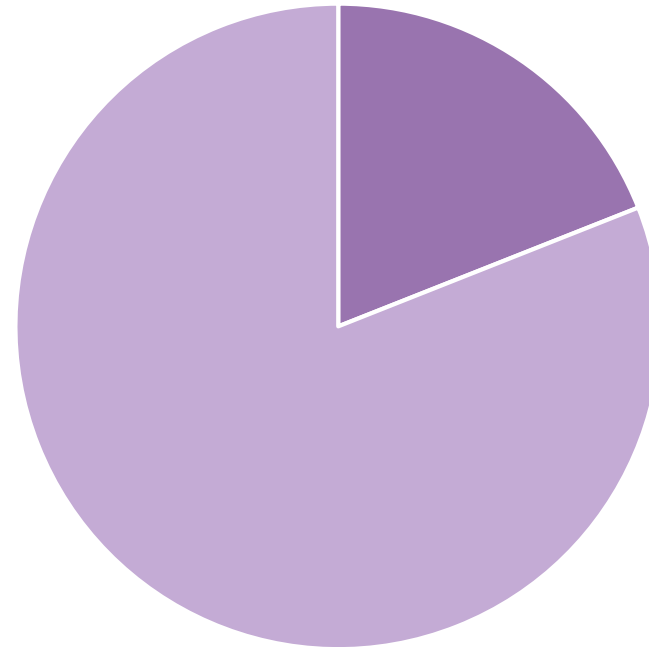
**At least one sexually harassing behavior (42%)**

LSU 42% = 12,600 students



**Interfered with academic or professional performance (19%)**

LSU 19% = 5,700 students

- Discrimination based on sex or gender
- Sexual Harassment
- Dating and domestic interpersonal violence
- Sexual assault
- Stalking
- Retaliation

you are:

- Deemed confidential by reason of law
- Designated as a Confidential Resource by LSU, specifically listed on the Title IX website, and participate in annual training specialized for Confidential Resources

Unless  
disclosure  
happens:

- During a public awareness event as part of educating others
- In the course of academic work consistent with an assignment
- As a matter of overhearing a conversation

### Student Reporting

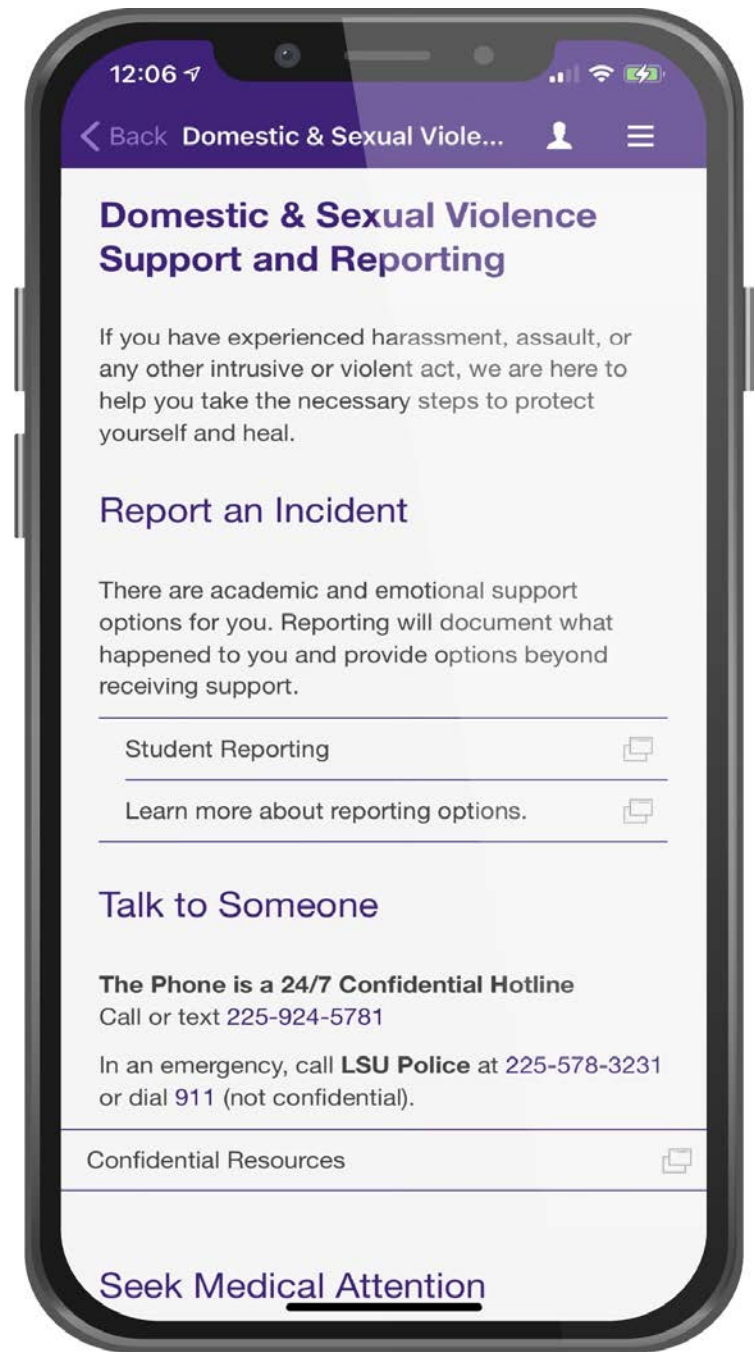
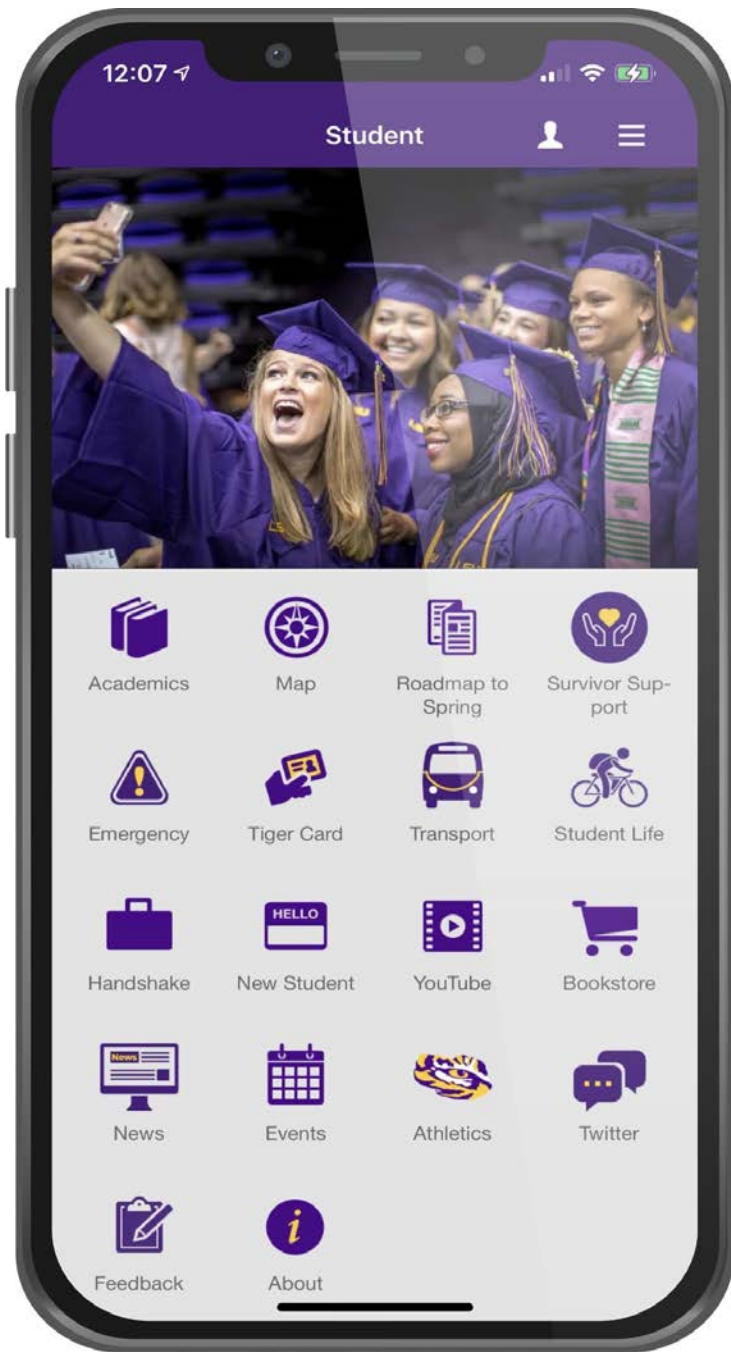

# What Do You Say?

- Ask if they are ok
- Tell them you are a mandatory reporter
- Offer to help them file the report themselves so they can be in control of the details



# Summary

Many sexual assaults happen on college campuses every year, and LSU is no exception.

Sexual misconduct can take many forms, and none of them are acceptable behaviors

If you witness any sexual harassment, if someone discloses to you, or if you have knowledge of it happening you are a mandatory reporter and if you do not report you may be out of a job.

You can report online, through an app, over the phone, or in person.
