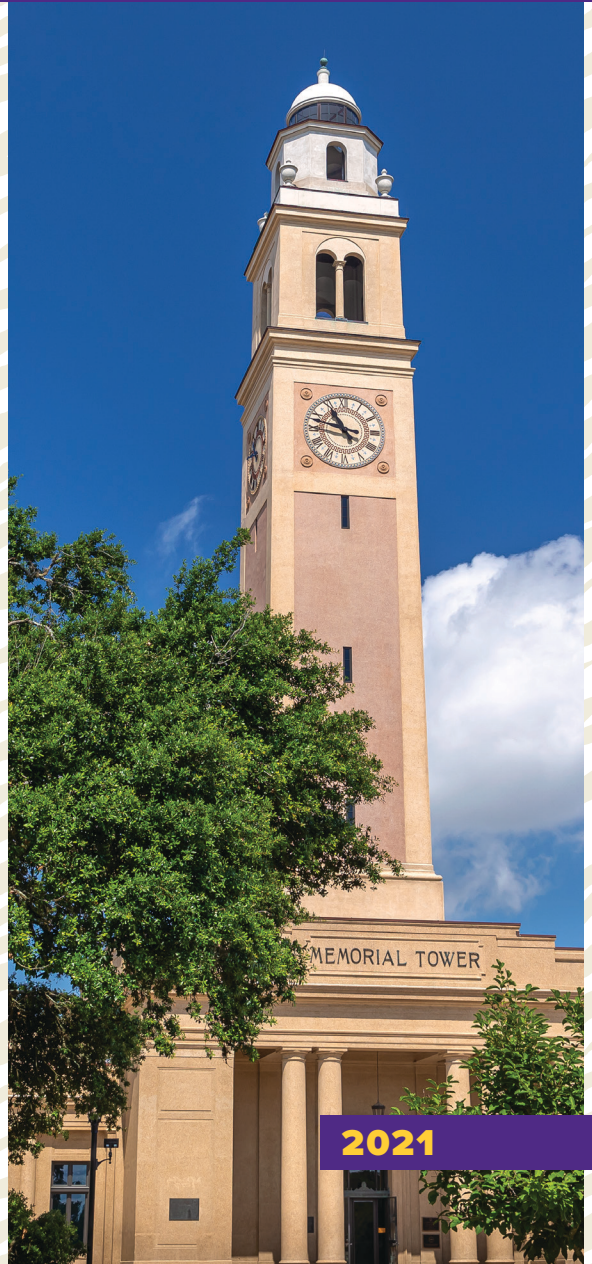

DID YOU KNOW?

- In fall 2021, LSU welcomed the most accomplished, largest, and most diverse freshman class in university history.
- LSU is in the elite 1 percent of U.S. universities having land-, sea-, and space-grant designations.
- In September 2021, LSU President William F. Tate IV was invited to the White House to brief President Joe Biden and his COVID Response Team on the success of LSU's COVID-19 mitigation strategies. As the only higher education representative invited to the event, President Tate joined representatives from Disney, Microsoft, Columbia Sportswear, Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Kaiser Permanente, Molly Moon's Homemade Ice Cream, and Business Roundtable.
- LSU is one of only eight universities in the nation with dental, law, veterinary, medical, and elite MBA programs.
- LSU's School of Veterinary Medicine is one of only 35 accredited colleges of veterinary medicine in the U.S. and Canada. The graduate program excels in research on equine health, vector-borne diseases, respiratory diseases, and molecular medicine and imaging.
